Nathan Boehm grew up on a 125 head registered Holstein and Jersey family farm, west of Mandan, North Dakota. Nathan graduated from North Dakota State University in 1989 and picked up the show bug while showing at the Saddle and Sirloin club's Litttle International. He continued to show only home bred cattle locally after that taking strings up to 27 head to fairs. Nathan was the herd manager and in charge of the Al program and was the breeder of the first excellent 95 point Holstein bred in North Dakota. The Jersey portion of the herd was started when Nathan purchased one registered heifer at the local sale barn. Through the Al program he grew the Jersey herd to 60 milking cows all descending from that original cow. He milked there until 2013 when the herd was dispersed and he currently works for the North Dakota Department of Agriculture as a livestock field investigator. Nathan has coached dairy judging for the three local FFA chapters and Morton county 4-H and Oliver county 4-H since 1987, taking 11 FFA and 14 4-H teams to the national contest. He also has judged many times at local county fairs since 1989 and the state 4-H dairy show in the late 90's. Nathan has judged numerous showmanship and round-robin contests over the years and thoroughly enjoys working with the kids and their projects. Nathan is married to Heather and has one daughter and son in-law and five grand kids.
